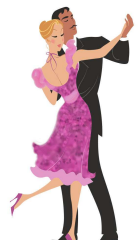

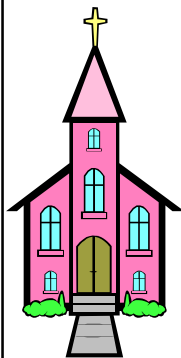

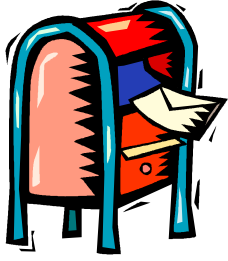

## FYI FROM KAY KITCHENS

### IN THE GREENFIELD POST OFFICE 2011-2012

Welcome to all the newcomers. Returning guests and homeowners. We have a few things to let you know about our post office.

We are an Official Postal Unit. You can buy stamps, mail letters, packages, Registered, Certified, Insured, International, Priority and Global Priority but not express mail (overnight) or sell money orders. Please check with us before making a trip to the post office.

If you are not registered at the Front Office, we cannot deliver mail to your box. We can start holding your mail if you let us know ahead of time.

We have the opportunity of an IN Park mail slot so you can send messages or greeting cards without postage. You **MUST** have your return lot # in the upper left corner and the **name and lot # of the receiver** in the middle of the piece or it cannot be delivered. Be careful when mailing in park mail. Mail going in the outgoing slot goes to Phoenix and is lost.

Club notice's must be approved by the Front Office and must be on a sheet at least ½ of an 8 ½ by 11. Smaller sheets tend to get lost in the mail.

We are responsible for abiding by all the rules set forth by the US Postal Service in order to keep this privilege.

**CANADA FRIENDS** when receiving mail from Canada the address should read

111 S Greenfield Rd Space #. US mail reads the address first then the space #.

I have manila and white large and small envelopes. Please notify your home post office when you are returning home. You can pick up a change of address for Greenfield or use the old one. You can order labels thru us 50 for \$2 or 100 for \$3.

Yellow or blue laminated cards in your mail means you have an article to pick up at the window. The Mesa Post office @ Lindsay & Broadway closed on Sept. 24, 2011. Greenfield Post Office is not in danger of closing at this time.

Please bring any 2012 calendars you don't need to the Post Office to share with others. Thank you for allowing me to be your Post Office Manager.

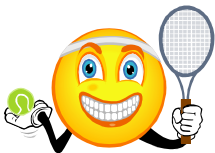

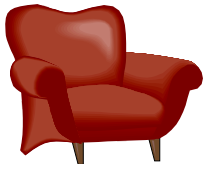
