

Safe travels home and hurry back!! We will be waiting for you!



# Manager's Korner!!

## Pool Rules

With our beautiful Arizona weather starting to cooperate and give us some warmer days, the pool will be very inviting for many of you. When coming and going from your home to the pool, please be sure you are covered up (towels wrapped around you are not considered cover ups). This is both men and women. You are not allowed to walk around with just your swimsuit anywhere except inside the pool area or going to the pool restrooms. DO NOT wear your swim shoes between your home and the pool. They become black from the streets and create havoc in the pool. You are welcome to wear swim shoes in the pool but you must change your shoes in the pool area. No suntan lotion or oils allowed in the pool. Everyone MUST shower before entering the pool or spa using the outdoor shower. This shower is only for rinsing, absolutely NO soaps or shampoos may be used in this shower. After using the pool you must use the pool restroom showers to shower with soap and shampoo or your shower in your own home, NEVER the outside pool shower. There is pool exercise at 8:30 and 11 am. If you are using the pool during those times, please stay at the south end so the exercisers can use the north end. Keep your talking down so they can hear their exercise tape instructions. Children hours are 10 am to noon, 2-4 pm and 6-8 pm. Children under 18 MUST be accompanied by an adult at all times. Children under 3 must wear a swim diaper. Residents are asked to bring their badge with them to the pool (in your bag is fine). Residents must be present with their guest while using the pool area.

## Barleen's AZ Opry Outing





# News

## A Letter from Fire Dept Station 205

Ryan Johnson here from Mesa Fire Station 205. We want to thank you for all of your efforts in putting this event together for us every year.

Mesa Fire Department was founded in 1898 with it's first station in downtown Mesa and we have just built our 22nd station on Power and Brown. Station 23 and Station 24 are both in the works right now. The station closest to Greenfield Village is Station 205, which was originally built in 1978. They finally received approval to build a new one, so you can see when you drive south on Greenfield, it was demolished last month. We are hoping our new station will be completed in the same spot sometime in 2027.

We have a new recording system that tracks all the calls at all addresses, so we don't have the exact numbers for Greenfield Village specifically, but it's safe to say the Fire Department was in Greenfield Village nearly every day, sometimes multiple times a day. 80% of our calls on average are medically related which could be anything from a simple fall, a diabetic issue, stroke, seizure, cardiac issues and even breathing problems. 15% of our calls are house fire, car fire, commercial fire and car accidents, the last 5% on average of our calls are haz mat, technical rescue or we just deem them a "service assignment" because we don't know what to call it. When people don't know what to do, they call the fire dept!!!

Some of the money from the fundraising from the past Bakery Auctions has gone to multiple items to make our minds and bodies better to help serve the citizens of

Greenfield Village better!!! For example, since we work 24 hour shifts, if we get to close our eyes between calls sometimes we really need to take advantage of that because some shifts we don't get to sleep at all. The mattresses were almost 20 years old and with the fundraising \$\$ every bed received a new mattress. Also, we have purchased a few items like a cold plunge and sauna to help recover faster after exhausting fires and long shifts. Some citizens of Mesa don't realize that firefighters have to pay for their own food and cable tv. Another use for the funds goes to keeping our pantry full of healthy food options for us and also paying for cable. We look forward to and are so grateful for these funds to help us keep our bellies full with healthy options and also we will use some of the money when the station is built to get new supplies for the new station.

# PETS

Protected under the Fair Housing Act and includes both Service Animals and Emotional Support Animals

Greenfield Village Resort  
CC&Rs Section 3.13 Animals and  
Resort Governance Pet Rules

## WHERE ALLOWED

Any lot. FHA is a federal law giving people with disabilities the right to have assistance animals.

Lots located in the designated Pet Area (103 - 132 & 148 - 201)

## NUMBER OF PETS

No preset limit, but each assistance animal must be individually necessary.

One dog, cat, or bird, or one such other animal as the Board may permit.

## REGISTRATION

No registration required but the animal does have to follow state rabies vaccination and local licensing laws.

All pets must be registered and proof of current rabies vaccinations must be on file in the office.

## OTHER

A simple note from a healthcare provider may be requested by the HOA. No medical records or diagnosis information required.

Pets must be transported, not walked, to and from the Pet Park.

Individuals may not request location and/or need for an Assistance Animals.

Visitors with pets - the pet must stay in the vehicle or the home if outside the pet section. Must be on a leash between vehicle and home. No overnight stays unless the visitor is staying in the designated pet area.

FHA does not require that the assistance animal be with the owner at all times.
