Manager's Korner!!

--Please be patient as we embark on a large construction project to have fiber optics installed for our resort. AireBeam, Lumen/Century Link, Team Fishel, and their subcontractors will be on site starting as soon as Thursday the 20th of November, for the next 2 months or so. There are many facets to this project, and we need your cooperation and understanding throughout the process. Staging of equipment, supplies and trucks has already begun!!

Did you know it is **required** to get an approved permit to do anything outside your unit EXCEPT for trimming and cleaning? See the Business Office for details. Please avoid areas with caution tape/cones around them. Remember on Holidays and Sundays, we do not allow work performed on the outside of your unit that brings noise.

In order to see this season through without any accidents, I am begging all of you to obey all stop and 10 mph speed limit signs AT ALL TIMES, no matter what mode of transportation you are using! It would be awful to hear of any of our folks getting injured because of negligence. With this in mind, please do not ride your bikes or stand-up scooters in the Common Area/sidewalks.

Also, when you have contractors or guests visiting, it would be helpful for you to remind them to only park on the same side of the street you put your garbage bags out on. This would allow first responders to avoid any delays in reaching their destination and having your neighbors navigate around without incident.

Absolutely DO NOT provide water or food for birds (minus hummingbirds) or feral cats in Greenfield Village! The food and water and the animals are a food source for coyotes. The coyotes will leave when the food source is

gone. Coyotes and the like bring potential health and safety issues to Greenfield Village Resort. I want to sincerely thank our wonderful volunteers who give of themselves for the greater good of our resort community. Without you, GVR could be very different. If you find yourself with too much unproductive time on your hands and wish to volunteer to help out, please contact me or Heidi and we'll be happy to assist in finding your niche. The 3 recycling bins at the Citrus Complex are for Clean, Corrugated, Crushed Cardboard only! Please follow the rules closely so we don't risk losing this recycling privilege. INVITATION TO TOWN HALL AND MEET THE CANDIDATES

Members of Greenfield Village Resort Association are invited to attend and participate in the pre-election TOWN HALL and MEET THE CANDIDATES sessions which kick-off our annual election cycle and Annual Home-owners Meeting of the Membership.

THE PREVIOUSLY-ANNOUNCED DATE FOR TOWN HALL HAS BEEN CHANGED.

This session will be held on Tuesday, January 6 at 1pm in the Ballroom and via Zoom.

Town Hall is held in accordance with Bylaw 3.12. This current session is designed as an opportunity for Members to ask questions and receive explanations about Issues which will appear on the Ballot for the Annual Meeting to be held Wednesday, February 11, 2026.

The February Ballot will contain the following Issues: election of Directors to the Board, approval of proposed Operating Fund and Replacement and Repair Reserve Fund budgets for FYE 6-30-27, approval of IRS Revenue Rule 70-604, and approval of Minutes of 2025 Annual Homeowners Meeting. Questions from Members and responses will be recorded and included in the Ballot Information and posted on the Condo-Web.

Town Hall is moderated by Board President, Roger Buys, and is estimated to last between 60 and 90 minutes.

Meet the Candidates, is designed as an opportunity for Members to ‘meet’ the candidates for the Board vacancies, to hear their answers to various questions ranging from acknowledging their skills to act as an effective director, to their familiarity with Resort governance, to their outlook to the future of Greenfield Village Resort.

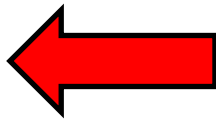

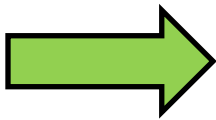
