Greenfield Village follows Federal Law as set out by the Fair Housing Act of the United States. Management of Greenfield Village HOA is not allowed legally to disclose not only why an individual may have an assistance animal, but also where that individual lives. Individuals of the community have no right to request this information. Please review the chart below.

Meet Bill Schneck,

Bill worked full time for ten years, while earning an A.A.S, two bachelors and a masters degree in Geology. One of his many jobs during this time was working as a Critical Care Respiratory Therapist in several hospitals. Although these jobs helped to pay for his education, he quickly realized working outside with rocks and minerals was where he desired to be.

After graduation, he landed a job doing geological mapping identifying minerals, fossils and studying the ages of rocks and soils which was more in line with getting him closer to his desired career. While on a fossil hunt in an abandoned coal mine, he discovered one of his crowning achievements which were fossil tracks of an amphibian-like creature that lived long before dinosaurs, previously unknown to the scientific world. He wrote an article about the discovery which was published in a peer-reviewed scientific journal. He donated the fossil to the Smithsonian, which is on rotating display still today.

Bill finally was able to start advancing toward what would become his 37-year career in the job of his dreams. Attending a seminar on Forensic Geology by Dr. Ray Murry, who was his long-time mentor, kick started him in a new direction which was his path to becoming a Trace Evidence Analyst. His on-the-job training for this new job was going to crime scenes with other scientists, detectives, medical examiners and forensic specialists. He became a Forensic Scientist in the position of a Trace Evidence Analyst for the Washington State Patrol working in the crime lab. Bill found himself on the witness stand as an expert witness in close to 150 trials. Bill was an impartial witness that let the evidence speak for itself. Another part of his job was recreating crime scenes. Bill was even an expert consultant for many of the Forensic Files T.V. show episodes. One of his most patriotic memories was authenticating the

missing 9-11 American flag that had disappeared shortly after that iconic photo of the firemen raising the flag at Ground Zero.

There came a time when Bill started a private practice to work for himself from home. When he built his new home, he designed it with a crime lab right in the house, where he was able to do 90% of his work while renting additional lab space for the other 10%. He worked investigations all over the country and Canada. Bill is semi-retired now but still works periodically while making Greenfield Village Resort his winter getaway by filling his day with the many hobbies that bring him joy. Bill is quite an avid landscape painter, woodworker, lapidarist and hikes with the group from the Resort. He also loves collecting, just as his father did, which includes an extensive collection of arrowheads his father started, but because of his love for hiking, he himself has found several arrowheads to add to the collection. Rocks and ancient artifacts are something he keeps his eyes open for each week on his hikes here in Arizona. Since microscopes are a huge part of his job, he also started collecting vintage microscopes. Bill restored a 1948 Chris-Craft wooden boat which he cruises around the lake with his wife, MaryJo. If you share any of the interests that Bill has, he would love to visit with you, make sure you stop and say hi.
