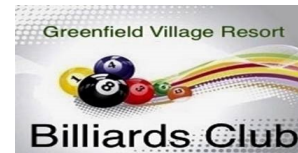

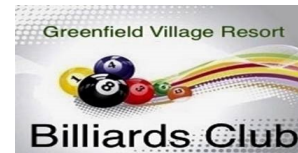

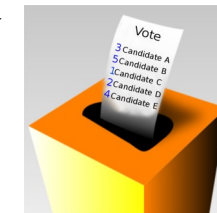
How to Vote at Greenfield Resort and have your vote count

This year you once again have an option as to your voting method. You can choose to vote like we have in the past with a paper ballot or you can vote electronically. Either way, you only get one vote per lot.

If you choose to vote by a paper ballot, you will need to fill out the ballot. Once finished, put the ballot into the envelope labeled "Ballot Envelope" and seal it. Then put this envelope into the other (security) envelope with green writing addressed to Greenfield Village on it and seal it. There is a label on the back of this envelope with your name and lot number on it, **DO NOT REMOVE THIS LABEL**. If this label is removed, your vote will not count. This label is the only way we know to verify that you are eligible to vote. Those owing money to Greenfield Village are not eligible to vote. The process by the Election Tally Committee is as follows. They put all the envelopes in order by lot number. They then make sure there is only one envelope for each lot and the homeowner is eligible to vote. In 2019 we had five owners who were not eligible turn in ballots. Those and the ballots without a name and address are put aside. When this is done then the outside "security" envelope is removed and the inside (ballot) envelope is put in a pile. **THE ELECTION TALLY COMMITTEE HAS NO IDEA WHAT BALLOT ENVELOPE COMES FROM A SPECIFIC MAILING ENVELOPE.** Finally before counting, the inside ballot envelope is opened and the ballots placed in piles to count.

PLEASE USE BOTH THE BALLOT ENVELOPE AND THE OUTSIDE SECURITY ENVELOPE AND LEAVE YOUR RETURN ADDRESS ON THE OUTSIDE SECURITY ENVELOPE. WE WANT TO

COUNT YOUR BALLOT! If you do not have the ballot envelope inside your mailing/security envelope- **YOUR VOTE WILL NOT COUNT.**



If you have chosen to vote electronically, you will receive an email from Election Buddy containing the ballot and instructions. Make sure you have added their email address to your address book or their email might go to your spam folder. invitations@mail.electionbuddy.com It is a very simple process. There will be a link in the email for you to click and that takes you straight to the ballot. Your ballot will look identical to the paper ballot. You will be able to click links to see the candidates bios and pictures and explanations of all the issues that you will need to vote on. You must vote one way or the other or abstain. You may not leave a question blank. When you have answered all the questions, the system gives you a chance to review your answers and make changes if you marked something wrong. Then click the submit button and you are done. Just to make sure that the email does not go into your spam/junk folder, we ask that you now go into your address book and add the email address of invitations@mail.electionbuddy.com This will insure that their email does not end up in your spam folder and you miss out on the vote altogether.

We have 442 of our residents choosing to vote electronically this year. Thank you, as this will save the Resort close to \$1,000!!! We encourage everyone to go this route next season.

RECYCLING HAS CHANGED!!

The city of Mesa is no longer providing front load bins for commingle recycling in Greenfield Village. Too many of our recyclables were contaminated with trash.

We now have 4 containers which **ONLY** accept CLEAN, CORRUGATED CARDBOARD (WITH A WAVY CENTER). Please break your boxes down flat before putting into the bins.

NO CANS, PLASTIC OR NEWSPAPERS ARE ACCEPTED FOR RECYCLING. IF IN DOUBT THROW IT OUT into the large dumpster behind the gates. If we do not do a better job of only putting CLEAN CORRUGATED CARDBOARD in the appropriate bins we may lose those bins as well.

We pay trash collection fees to the City of Mesa based on the weight of our trash. If we can recycle more items our costs will be reduced.

Aluminum cans are collected in the cans located to your left as you enter the Citrus Complex. Please remove the plastic bags used to carry your cans and put them in the garbage. **THANK YOU FOR HELPING US "KEEP THE GREEN IN GREENFIELD"!**

BBQ Food Truck

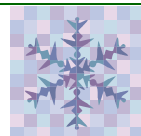
